PROPOSED MOTIONS

- #1 Approve the minutes from last year's Annual Meeting
- #2 Motion to Adopt the 8th Principle

I move that the proposed 8th Principle, as stated in the 2021 Annual Meeting program and approved by the Board of Trustees be adopted.

The 8th Principle of Unitarian Universalism

"We, the member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote: journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions."

#3 Motion to Adopt the Congregational Covenant

I move that the proposed Congregational Covenant by the Board of Trustees for First Parish Brewster for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022, as stated in the 2021 Annual Meeting program be adopted, with the right reserved to the Board of Trustees to make changes to such Covenant in response to First Parish Brewster members' suggestions at the end of the fiscal year.

FPBUU Congregational Covenant

- 1. We respect the wisdom of all, in a friendly and loving manner. Everyone deserves to be heard, including our children and youth.
- 2. We approach one another as spiritual partners. Before speaking, we take a breath and think: Is it true? Is it kind? Will it help? We speak directly and openly with empathy, compassion, and kindness. We use "I" statements and respect healthy boundaries.
- 3. We act in good faith according to our UU values. We listen carefully to the decisions made by leadership and expect our leaders to honor the voices of those who disagree. When needed, we follow processes of reconciliation and resolution through Right Relations.
- 4. We embrace questions and engage directly, listening deeply. When conflict appears, we see it as an opportunity for change and growth. Understanding our differences, we allow for missteps, and welcome feedback. We seek the goal of reconciliation, encouraging peer and social support when needed.
- 5. We aspire to be our best selves. Whenever we need to, we have the capacity to gently remind and call each other back into covenant, into the widening circle of our loving community.

#4 Motion to Approve Budget for FY21-22

I move that the budget proposed by the Board of Trustees for First Parish Brewster for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022, as stated in the warrant, be adopted, with the right reserved to the Board of Trustees to make changes to such budget in response to changed financial circumstances, provided, however, that, in accordance with Article VII, Section 6 of the FPB Bylaws, no expenditure shall be made unless an adequate appropriation has been voted by the Board and funds therefore have been secured, and provided further, that no payments or commitments in excess of an amount equal to five percent of the budget shall be made by the Board without a prior appropriation therefore or approval thereof at a Special Meeting of the congregation.

#4 Motion to Approve Trustees, Officers, and Committee Members for FY21-20

In accordance with Article VII, Section 2; Article VIII, Section 1, Article IX, Section 2, and Article X, Sections 1 and 3 of the First Parish Brewster Bylaws, I move that the congregation approve the Leadership Development Committee's proposed nominations for the positions of Board trustees and officers, members of the Leadership Development Committee, members of the Endowment Board and the Children and Youth Ministries Committee as listed in the Annual Meeting Program.

BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. Please refer to the spreadsheet 'Board approved proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022' which runs from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. We will be focusing on the column on the right 'Proposed FY22 Budget (2021-2022).
- 2. Line 134: We are going to start at the end, line 134 shows a balance budget.
- 3. Line 132: \$48,851 is about 2/3 of the current year surplus which we will use in the 21-22 proposed budget and hold 1/3 for following year's operating budget.
- 4. Lines 4 and 8: We expect pledges of \$375,378, an increase of about \$25,000, and net about the same after factoring in lost pledges and pledges received from the prior year.
- 5. Line 12: The Thrift Shop budget increased substantially and could see further growth. It is limited primarily by the number of volunteers willing to commit a few hours a month to staffing Thrift Shop and Annex. If you are interested in this high-impact volunteer opportunity, please contact Celine, our Thrift Store Manager.
- 6. Lines 33-59: The adjustments to the three main staff categories followed the Head of Staff recommendations, for Salaries (increase about \$19,000), Benefits (increase about \$11,000), and Professional expense (increase about \$3,309). Staff who were not already within UU recommended salary levels will see a 1% to 6% salary increase. We budgeted for the temporary tech-support position through September 2021, at which time we expect to start meeting in person. All full-time employees will now get 100% paid dental insurance. The minister's professional expenses remain 10%, and the professional expenses of other directors increased from 4% to 6% of salary.
- 7. Lines 61-63: Per policy we allocate 5% of our budgeted income towards property management, half of which is in our operating budget and designated as maintenance and the other half will be requested from Endowment for capital improvements.
- 8. Line 87: We have budgeted \$25,000 for denominational dues to the UUA. They requested \$33,122 based on a % of our annual budget.
- 9. Line 89: We have budgeted for eight guest ministers to cover times when the Minister is not in the pulpit at a cost of \$350 fee plus \$100 travel per guest speaker.
- 10. Lines 121 and 128: about \$4,000 increase in religious education and music expenses.
- 11. A final general comment: Overall expenses will increase \$53,000 in the proposed 21-22 budget. Almost all of that is paid for by this year surplus. In FY 22-23 about half will be paid for with the remainder of the surplus and the balance from anticipated increase in pledges and other income streams. We count on the efforts of the mighty Fundraising Committee and support from all of you. The Minister, Administration and Finance Director, Stewardship Committee, Finance Committee and Board of Trustees will provide financial leadership to move confidently in the direction of the hopes, dreams, and aspirations of this beloved community. This is a budget that is built for growth and is sustainable over the long term.

Annual Meeting Minutes - June 14, 2020

First Parish Brewster Unitarian Universalist Society By Zoom

- I. Call to order FPBUU Board President Jim Hild called the meeting to order at 11:40 AM.
- II. Establishment of a quorum (68) In accordance with Article VI, Section 4 of FPBUU bylaws, FPBUU Clerk Susan Smith established that a quorum of FPBUU members were present with 88 screens on Zoom.
- III. Election of Moderator Jim Hild opened the floor for nominations for Moderator. Lindsey Straus was nominated and seconded. The motion passed. Lindsey acknowledged the challenges of Covid-19 and Zoom, how we will be using the chat box, and that we will be muting and unmuting individuals as they wish to speak.
- IV. Approval of minutes from last year's annual meeting Lindsey Straus requested a motion to approve the minutes for the June 9, 2019 Annual meeting. A motion from the floor was made and seconded. The motion passed.
- V. President's Report Jim Hild, presented an overview of the work of FPBUU Board of Trustees for the fiscal year 2019/2020. His presentation focused on a few areas, including three Board goals.

- Goal 1 Develop a legacy of effective governance and sustainable leadership. Having successfully disestablished the Council, we needed to establish additional reorganization and improved communication, which included a successful all committee meeting.
- Goal 2 Develop a plan based on the recommendations of the Facilities Task Force. We were in the process of consulting Dan Hotchkiss to design a capital campaign for facilities improvements, when the pandemic hit and this work had to stop. This is currently on hold and hopefully can resume next year.
- Goal 3 Develop short and long term plans. Assuring a smooth transition between Board years, the Past President, President and President-Elect worked closely with the minister on various issues. This year four new policies have been developed. The work of the church has been greatly affected by Covid-19, causing our campus to close and our meetings to become virtual. We established a Covid Task Force to help guide us how and when it is advisable to reopen the church. In sum, the Board has been highly effective in responding to the changing needs of our church. There has been a close working relationship among each other and the staff, to address and come to consensus on several difficult issues.

VI. Endowment Board Report Howard Hayes, financial secretary, presented a report on the FPBUU Endowment Fund on behalf of Susan Flaws, chair. This year the Endowment Board distributed \$24,352 to Beloved Conversations, a congregational retreat, special event advertising, and \$20,000 repayment of the loan from the Endowment Fund. Next year the maximum distribution, based on 5% of principle will be \$31,000. This fund is managed by Cape Cod Five Trust and Asset Mgt. As of April 30, the fund stood at \$931,071.12. The balance on the building loan repayment fund is \$41,882.09. Remaining on the building loan is \$130,117.91 Gifts were received in memory of Dick Adami, Dave Akin, Janet Bell, Rob Gorman, Joanrose Kueng, Rob Moir, Dick Muniz, Veronica Powers, Shirley Re, Rachel Stowe, and Dana Wright. In addition, the fund received an annual gift from the Henry and Lucy Patterson Charitable Fund from the Cape Cod Foundation. Endowment members this year are Linda Bailey-Davies; Bob Flanagan; Susan Flaws, chair; Dick Guernsey, recording secretary; Howard Hayes, financial secretary; and ex officio members the Minister; President and Treasurer of the Board; and Administration & Finance Director.

VII. Treasurer's Report, Request to Endowment & Budget Approval Diane Pansire presented an overview of the proposed budget in these extraordinary times of pandemic. She highlighted and gave further explanation to three topics which were raised at the Finance presentation. Why are we keeping our staff at current levels? Why are we taking funds from the Endowment Fund? Why is OMG canceled? Pat Stover made a motion to approve the use of Endowment Funds. The motion was seconded and is attached. After some questions and discussion, the motion passed by the necessary ½ vote. Dave Winther made a motion to approve the budget for fiscal year 2020/21. The motion was seconded and is attached. Rikki Bates initially presented an amendment which was not in order. Discussion followed. Elenita Muniz made a motion which was seconded to call the question to proceed with a vote on the budget. The motion failed to get 2/3 approval. Discussion followed. Vicki Goldsmith made a motion which was seconded to present a budget amendment to add \$1,200 taken from net pledges line 6, and restore \$1,200 to OMG line 126. Discussion followed. Amendment failed 39 yes 46 no. Karen Watson-Etsell called the question to vote on the motion to approve the budget. The motion passed. The motion to approve the budget as proposed passed by the necessary ½ majority, with between 71 and 74 yes votes.

VIII. Leadership Development Committee Report Judy Harrison, Chair gave her report. Members of the LDC are Anne Barry, Julia Enroth, Patsy Roberts and Judy Harrison. According to the charge to LDC to fill vacancies on the Board of Trustees, LDC and the Endowment Board, Judy presented the slate to be voted on by the congregation as listed in the program:

PROPOSED MOTIONS

Motion to Approve Use of Endowment Funds for Operating Expenses in FY20-21 - Pat Stover

I move, given the particular, temporary and extraordinary circumstances created by the Covid-19 pandemic and as expressly authorized by the terms of Article XII, Section 4 of the Bylaws, that the Congregation, having obtained the necessary written approval of the Endowment Board and of its Board of Trustees, approve the use of a portion of the Endowment Board's unrestricted fund balance at the end of calendar year 2019, up to but not to exceed the sum of One Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000.00), for the operating expenses of First Parish Brewster in FY 2021. Endowment Motion Explanation The Endowment Bylaws provide that "Only in particular, temporary, extraordinary circumstances... may the Congregation, by a two-thirds vote at a duly called meeting, use a portion of the FUND for its own operating expenses..." The Endowment Board endorses the Board of Trustees' request to use up to \$110,000 for operating expenses in FY 21. The allowed 5% distribution for FY 21 is \$31,000. Thus, the request is for an additional \$79,000. The total of all Endowment funds as of 4/31/2020 is \$972,274.

Motion to Approve Budget for FY20-21 Dave Winther

I move that the budget proposed by the Board of Trustees for First Parish Brewster for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021, as stated in the warrant, be adopted, with the right reserved to the Board of Trustees to make changes to such budget in response to changed financial circumstances, provided, however, that, in accordance with Article VII, Section 6 of the FPB Bylaws, no expenditure shall be made unless an adequate appropriation has been voted by the Board and funds therefore have been secured, and provided further, that no payments or commitments in excess of an amount equal to five percent of the budget shall be made by the Board without a prior appropriation therefore or approval thereof at a Special Meeting of the congregation.
