A journey of faith, solidarity, and hope.

The Plymouth Justice Pilgrimage is a six-day walk from Provincetown to the Plymouth County Correctional Facility.



We walk in solidarity with immigrants held in civil immigration detention.



We walk to raise support for BIJAN (Barnstable Immigrant Justice Action Network).



We walk because we believe every person possesses inherent dignity.

• OUR STORY •

In the summer of 2019, we undertook a 140-mile pilgrimage from Detroit to the National Shrine of Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, Massachusetts. Along the way, we walked in solidarity with immigrants detained at the U.S.–Mexico border, meeting people, sharing conversations, and praying together.

That journey changed us.

Although the pilgrimage ended, its questions remained. How could we continue walking in solidarity with those whose dignity is too often overlooked?

The Plymouth Justice Pilgrimage is one answer to that question.

WHY PLYMOUTH?



WHY PLYMOUTH?

The Plymouth County Correctional Facility is the only facility in Massachusetts that contracts with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to detain individuals in civil immigration proceedings.



WHY WALK THERE?

Pilgrimages have long been a way of bearing witness to places that invite reflection, prayer, and action. We walk to Plymouth not in condemnation, but in solidarity—with those experiencing detention, with their families, and with the organizations that accompany them.



WHY THIS ISSUE?

Civil immigration detention often happens out of public view. Individuals are held for many different reasons while their immigration cases proceed through the civil immigration system. Our hope is simple: to encourage learning, foster compassionate conversation, and **affirm the dignity of every human person.**

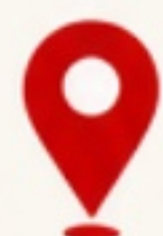

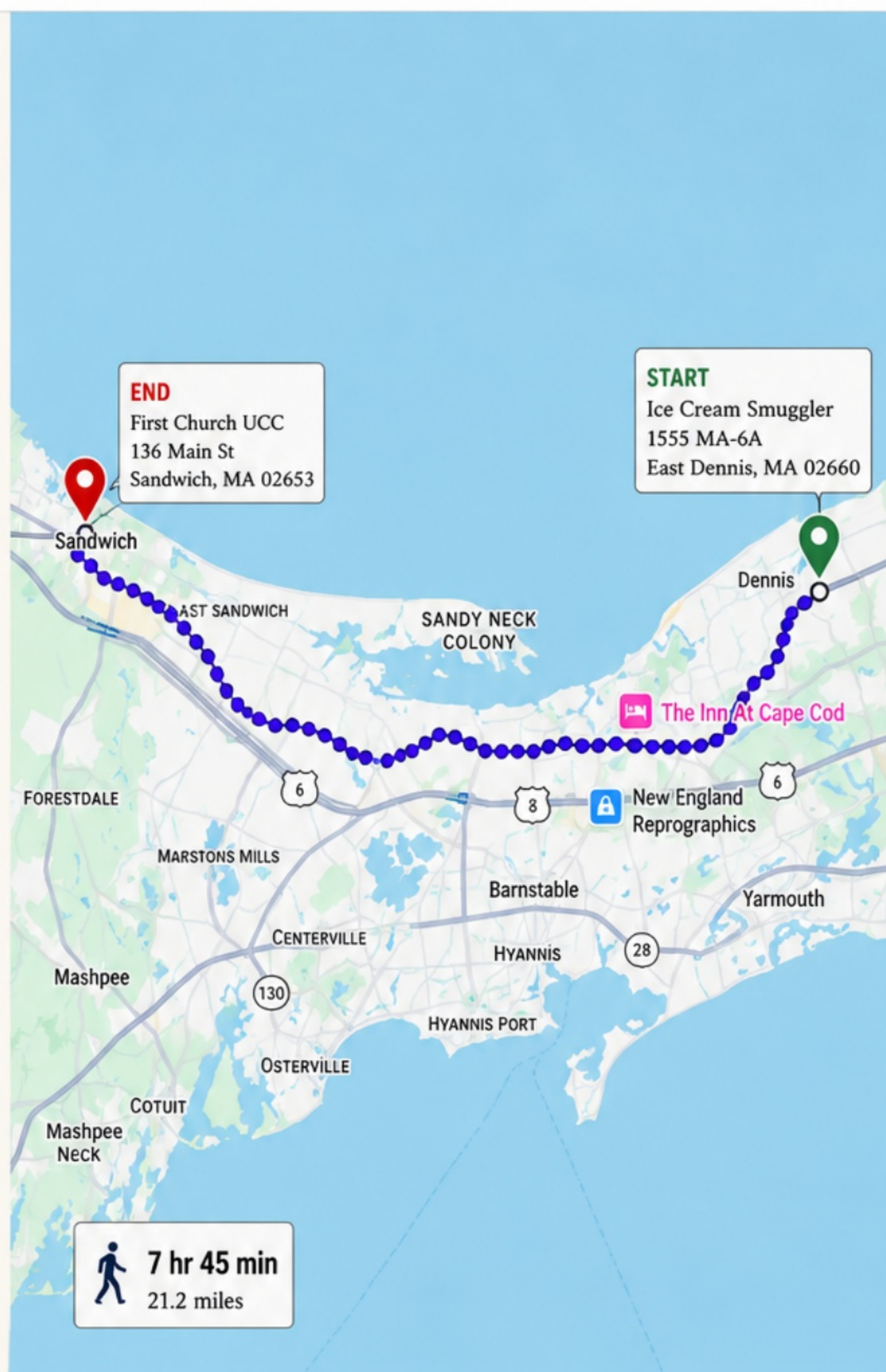

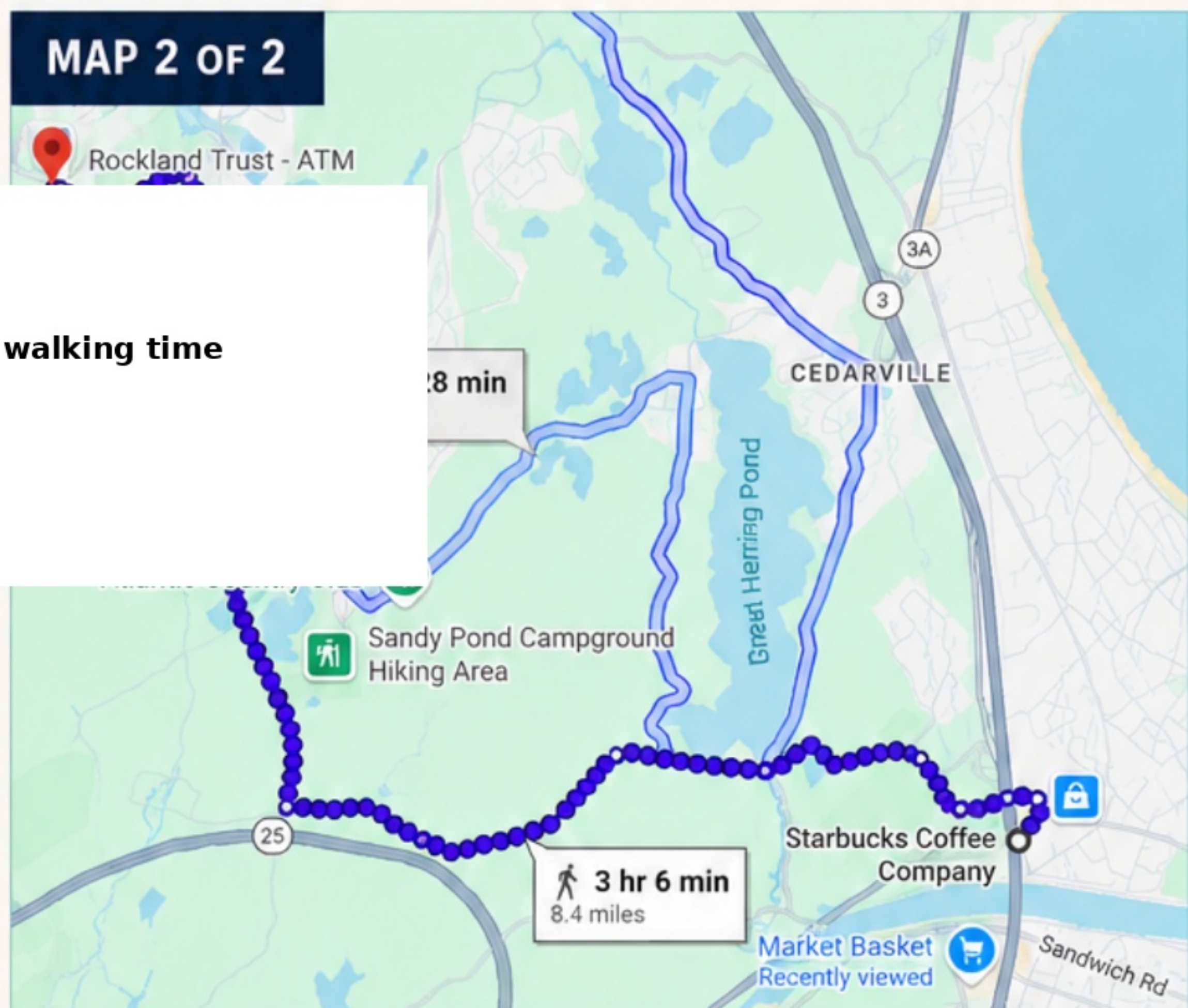
